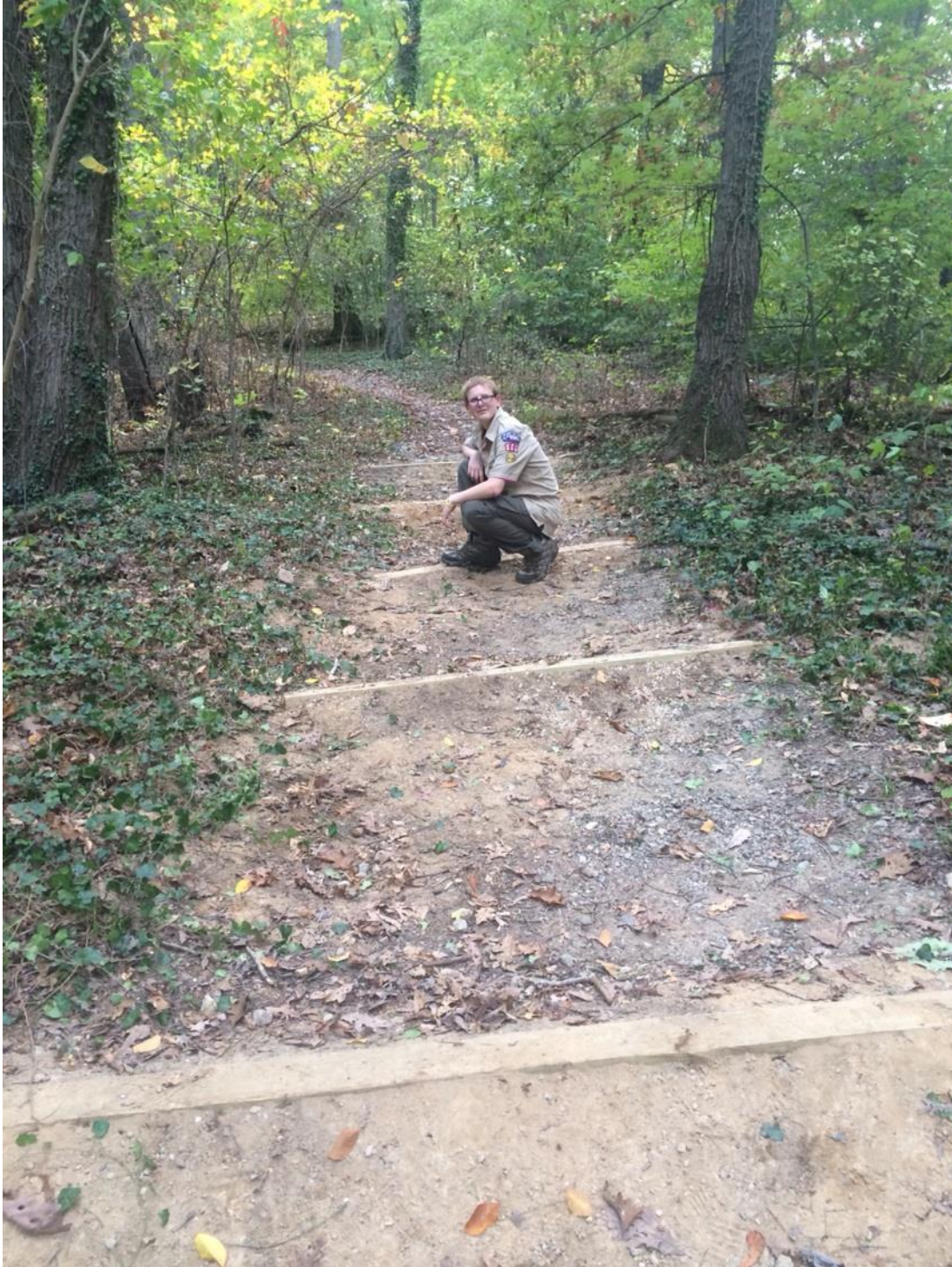


Greyson Acquaviva – Eagle Scout Project October 2014
